- Art (Visual)** You may submit a maximum of TEN good quality slides, photos, copies or digital prints of your best artwork. Maximum dimension of photos or digital prints is 8.5 x 11 inches. Do not send CDs, DVDs or links to Web sites. Write your name on each slide or photo, along with the medium and completion date. No binders, folders or albums. If your work was a performance or installation, send still images and a description documenting the project. If you have received any awards or honors, you may wish to list them on a separate sheet.
- Music** You may submit a tape or CD (audio format), up to 10 minutes in length, representing your abilities. Do not send VHS tapes. CDs must be designed for standard players. You should choose a solo performance or a piece in which your performance is prominent. Two or more contrasting pieces that show a range of ability are encouraged. Indicate your name, instrument/voice part and work performed on the tape itself. Also, you may attach a résumé summarizing your vocal, instrumental or compositional background (list years studied, instructors, awards, etc.).
- Theater** You may submit a DVD, up to 10 minutes in length, representing your abilities. Also, you may attach a resume summarizing your theater background (including awards, roles in productions, instructors and other pertinent information). Technical Theater students may submit a portfolio of work in place of the DVD.

If you are submitting supplementary material for consideration, please describe briefly the contents of your submission and, if appropriate, identify your role (e.g., musical instrument, voice or composer). Materials submitted without this supplement cannot be evaluated.
