Objectives

The objective of the East African Geographical Review (EAGR) is to disseminate ideas. The EAGR will provide an outlet for researchers who are doing research on African topics in general and East Africa in particular.

Aims and Scope

The EAGR aims to be the leading research journal in the field of geography in as far as Africa is concerned but more importantly in Eastern Africa. It intends to:

- ☛ Inform scholars, policy makers and other interested members of the best research in the field on the region through primary research articles. It will also carry articles of interest to urban and regional planners and other social scientists interested in geographic research.
- ☛ Promote and enhance the East African regional standing of geography through exchange of views on geographic and related research.
- ☛ Provide a viable forum for East African geographers and other scientists to assess and apply philosophical and methodological developments in the physical, social and behavioral sciences.
- ☛ Review and evaluate the importance of geography based on recent findings in all subdisciplines of the field, and the broader social sciences in general.

Publication

The EAGR will be published twice every year -- March and December. Approximately 6-8 articles per issue will be published. Each volume of the journal will contain two issues. The content of each issue will be research articles, but the journal will from time to time contain book reviews, and special articles commissioned by the editors that report current debates or review important themes. The editors welcome all contributions from researchers in all subdisciplines of geography and other fields.
