




The Developed & Developing World:

Inservice Training for Middle & Secondary Teachers



Macalester College, St. Paul
June 28 - July 2, 2004 and July 26- July 30, 2004



- This course was based at Macalester College (St. Paul, MN) and consisted of three braided strands: (1) content lectures by geographers, and (2) use of technology for web-based instruction, and (3) tutorials on the use of a variety of curriculum materials. It will be conducted for one week in July of 2004.
- Goal 1: Provide in-service training for twenty (20) to thirty-five (35) teachers drawn from schools in Minnesota. Content focus will be the new Minnesota Geography Standards related to the economic, urban, political and cultural geography of Sub-Saharan Africa, Latin America, East Asia and South East Asia. The exact topics covered will depend upon the availability of geographers with expertise in these areas.
- Goal 2: Working with the master teachers, participants will modify curriculum for their courses to incorporate the new materials presented.
- Goal 3: The participants will introduce their revised and/or expanded units into their curriculum during the following school year.
- Goal 4: Those teachers adept at using the on-line classroom software will work with our technology instructors to prepare materials for the virtual classroom and provide the foundation for a continuing web-based instructional program on the issues developed in the institute.
- Teachers participating in the workshop will receive two graduate credits, \$200 worth of curriculum materials and a stipend of \$250 to assist with their costs for child care, transportation, and meals. A limited number of room and board scholarships will be provided for teachers who work beyond the commuting distance to and from Macalester College.
