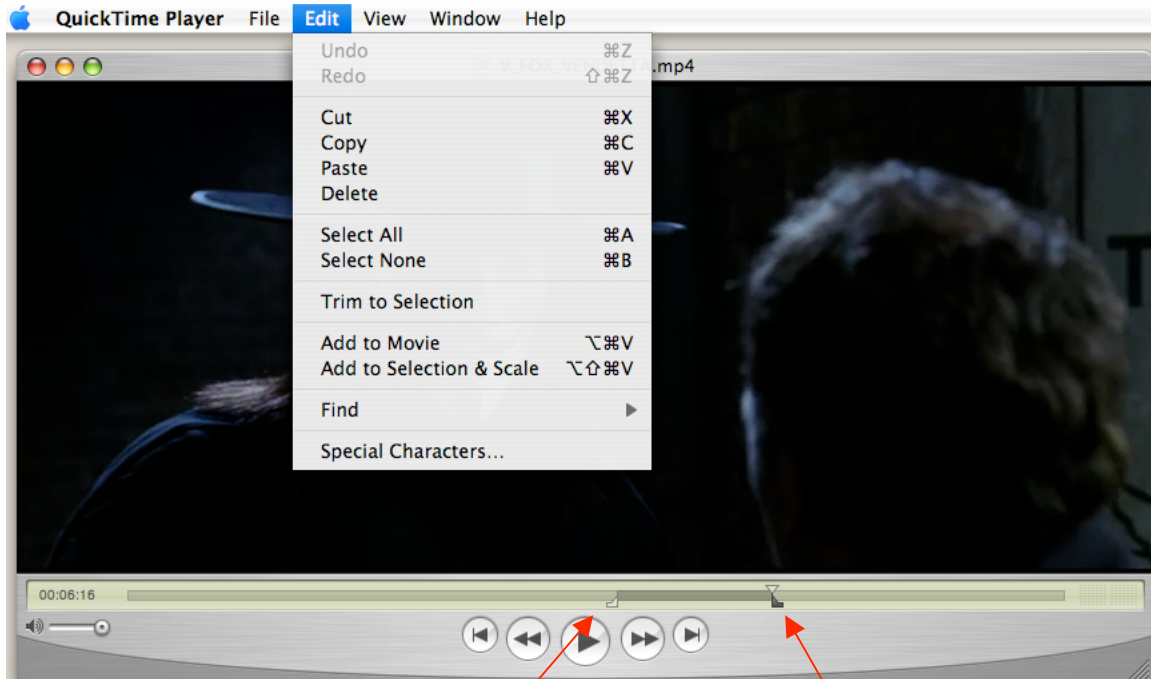


## QuickTime Pro

Editing with QuickTime Pro is simple and fast once you already have a digital video clip (mpeg, avi, or mov file), if you need to create a digital clip from a DVD, please see the document on Handbrake.

Open the file in Quicktime. When you mouse-over the timeline, two little carets will appear. Drag these across the timeline until you have selected a portion of video (the selected portion is the part of the video between carets)



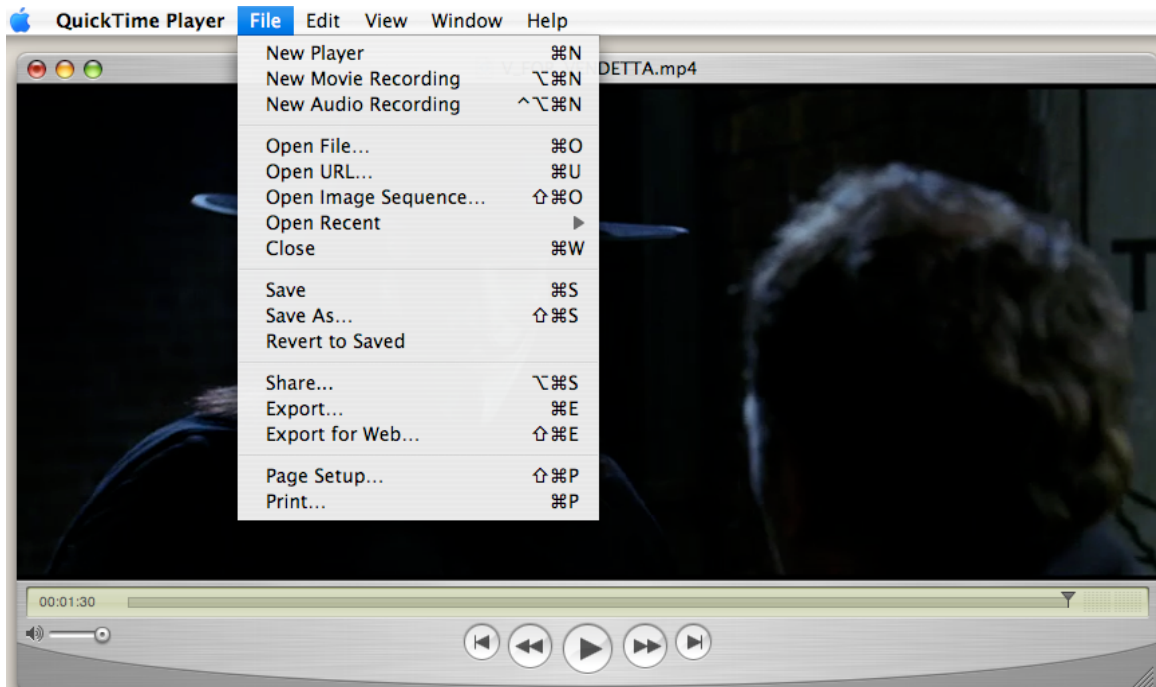

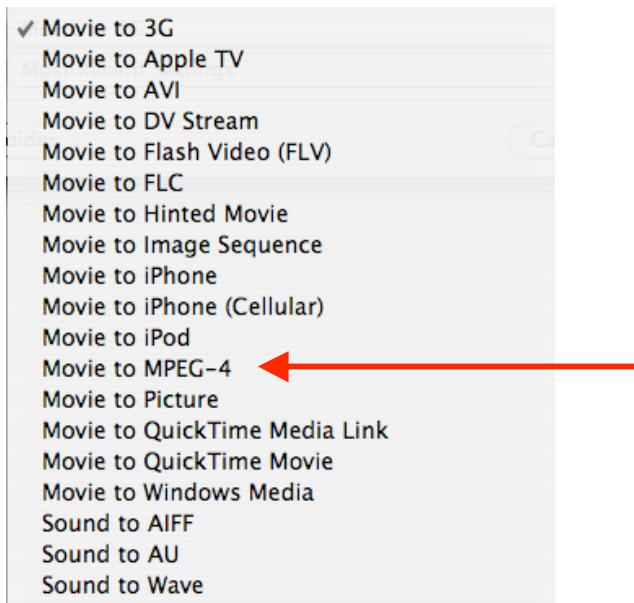
Then you can use the *Edit* menu to either remove that portion of video (*Cut* or *Delete*) or *Trim to Selection* (get rid of everything but the selected piece). If you make a mistake you can always *Edit > Undo*.

If you want to pull multiple clips out of one video file and make them into separate files, you can select the section, chose *Copy* then go *File > New* then *Edit > Paste*. This will create a new file without changing the original one.

Once you have trimmed your clip down to be the way you want, go to the file menu. Here you have two main options for saving the clip. If you chose “*Save As*” you will name the clip and save it as a quicktime movie file with a .mov extension.



If you chose “*Export*” you will have a broader range of file type options, including MPEG-4.



It is worth noting that Saving or Exporting may take a few minutes depending on the length of the clip and file type you are exporting to.
