

Network Connection

for Macintosh



This document will explain how to connect to a campus wireless network with a Macintosh OS X computer. Your computer must have a wireless networking card running the 802.11b (or 802.11b/g) standard that is correctly installed and functioning. See the documentation for your computer or wireless card for installation instructions.

OS X Wireless Connection

If your Macintosh has an AirPort card, you can connect to the wireless network. To check for an AirPort card:

- From the Apple menu, choose **About This Mac**
- Click the **More Info** button
- Under the Hardware (or Network) arrow (in the left pane), click **AirPort Card**

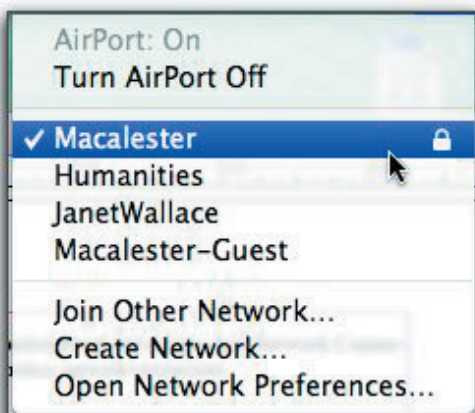
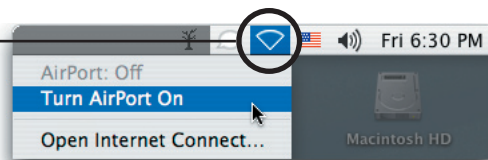


If no information is given, you do not have an AirPort card installed.

- Close the window

To connect to the Macalester wireless network:

- Click the AirPort icon in the top-right area of the screen
- If necessary, select **Turn AirPort On**
- Use the AirPort menu again to connect to "Macalester"



- In the Password field, type the Macalester Network access password
