

Handbrake


You can download Handbrake for free from http://handbrake.fr/ for Mac or PC.

Insert your DVD then open Handbrake. Click on the Source button on the top left.



When this box pops up, select your DVD and choose Open (Note, you will want to select the whole DVD, not a sub-folder within the DVD)






There are a few basic settings to check when using Handbrake.

- **1. Source** you want to make sure you have the correct title and chapter of the clip.
- **2. Destination** This is the location where the clip will be saved
- **3. Format** the recommended format is MP4 file.
- **4. Target Size** for putting clips on Moodle you should have your target size set to 47 MB or less

Note that # 4 is located under the **Video** tab...

Remember, it is your responsibility to work within the fair use guidelines of using only 3 minutes or 10% of a given copyrighted work. If you have questions about fair use please contact your library liaison.



- ...there are also several settings you should be aware of under the **Audio & Subtitles** tab. Especially when working with foreign films
- 1. [Audio] Track Make sure you have the correct audio track, most DVDs have audio tracks for foreign language dubbing
- **2. Subtitles** If you want the subtitles included, you can select them here.

When you have all the settings ready, hit the *Start* button at the top of the program
