



Villa of the Antonines

The Villa of the Antonines is believed to have been the property of the second century CE Roman imperial family of the Antonines. Students will be working on the recently-identified amphitheater, its relationship to the baths, and probable residential quarters discovered in 2014, together with mosaics, mosaic tesserae, fragments of painted stucco, and pieces of luxurious, imported marble that are characteristic of the site. Participants will receive hands-on training in all aspects of archaeological investigation including geophysical survey, mapping, and cultural heritage management.
