MACALESTER COLLEGE

In March 2021, Macalester College celebrated the 147th anniversary of its founding. The college received its charter from the State of Minnesota in 1874, and for the next several years its founders raised funds, hired faculty, planned courses, completed a classroom-office-residence building, and recruited students in preparation for Macalester's opening in September 1885.

The legacy of those founders—Presbyterian ministers and educators who strove for rigor and excellence—is a liberal arts college recognized for its academic excellence, its traditions of international and intercultural understanding, and its commitment to civic engagement.

To carry out its educational mission, Macalester has assembled a distinguished faculty of 220 full-time and 70 part-time teachers and scholars who represent a broad array of disciplines in the natural sciences, social sciences, humanities, and fine arts. Macalester's 2,009 full-time and 40 part-time students represent 50 states (and Washington, D.C.) in the United States and 95 other nations. Their academic achievements are numerous and impressive, as demonstrated by awards including 13 Rhodes Scholarships since 1904, and, in the last 10 years, 62 Fulbright Grants, 42 National Science Foundation Fellowships, 10 Thomas J. Watson Fellowships, four Truman Scholarships, four Goldwater Fellowships, one Beinecke Scholarship, and one Udall Scholarship.

Macalester's international emphasis is reflected in the fact that about 60 percent of its students study abroad for a semester or more during their college careers. The four-year civic engagement participation rate for graduating seniors is consistently well over 90 percent with students contributing, at some point during their college careers, to a variety of organizations in the Twin Cities and beyond.

Close to 60 percent of Macalester graduates enroll in further study or complete an advanced degree within six years after graduation. Macalester alumni pursue careers in business, medicine, law, social service, government, the arts, religion, and many other fields. They make significant contributions to their professions, their communities, and the world. More than 30,500 alumni welcome into their ranks the Macalester College graduates of 2021—Macalester's 132nd graduating class—and wish them success and fulfillment.

CONFERRING OF HONORARY DEGREE TO ELONA STREET-STEWART

Citation presented by President Suzanne M. Rivera

Elona Street-Stewart. Steadfast leader, pathmaker, champion of justice and education. You are a tireless advocate for empowerment and equal opportunity in the communities you serve.

A descendent of the Delaware Nanticoke tribe, your story begins centuries before you were born, with what you describe as the "intentional and continuous erasure of Native people." Your parents and grandparents fought for quality education for their families and their people. In your own schools, you encountered ideas about how America originated with European explorers. "That's an abomination," you later said. "It was our languages that named the mountains, the rivers, the land, the birds, the trees."

At Occidental College, you quickly seized opportunities to participate in literary forums, lift up justice issues, and connect to what it means to be a peacemaker. In 1973, you earned your bachelor's degree in anthropology. The connections you forged at Occidental led to your work with the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

The church has benefited from your service and leadership on a national level since 1980. For decades, you've poured yourself into racial ethnic ministry, anti-racism initiatives, and community empowerment. In 2016, you became the first Native American to serve as executive of a Presbyterian Synod, a regional division of the church. You look after the upper Midwest, an area that includes 790 churches and over 100,000 members. You've challenged the church to address systems of privilege, and to account for the suffering of Native people and others who have been trampled over and silenced. "Please learn from us," you told the Minnesota Council of Churches, "and do not preside over us."

Alongside your church leadership, you've focused on improving education in public schools. You were the first Native American to serve on an urban district school board in Minnesota, elected to multiple terms as chair of the St. Paul Board of Education. During your 13-year tenure, you led several minority education and anti-discrimination initiatives. From challenging the myth of Thanksgiving to encouraging the question, "What can we learn from Native traditions about quality education?" you embody inclusivity and advocacy.

Your educational contributions have been recognized far and wide. The Council of Urban Boards of Education named you one of the top 10 school board members in the nation. Former first lady Laura Bush applauded your work toward a nationwide effort to raise awareness about the challenges facing youth. Occidental College awarded you the Alumni Seal Award for Professional Achievement, a tribute to your use of education to lead and empower your community.

Last year, you undertook the highest elected position in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) as Co-Moderator of the church's national General Assembly. Alongside Reverend Gregory Bentley, you presided over the denomination's first online assembly. As Co-Moderator, you aim to dismantle systemic racism in the church through building inclusive policies and decolonizing practices. You will serve as an ambassador throughout your term.

Elona Street-Stewart, you appear before us today as a woman who has shattered glass ceilings and as a Native woman who has broken down barriers to serve at the highest levels of leadership in the church and educational spheres. As the parent of a 1999 Mac grad, you are a member of the Macalester family.

Today, we honor you for your achievements, your fierce dedication to equitable education, and your commitment to values we at Macalester hold so dear: excellence, service, inclusion, and justice. We hereby bestow upon you the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.



THE COMMENCEMENT SETTING

Our Commencement setting this year looks very different than in years past. We are spread throughout the country and indeed the world due to the global pandemic. Traditionally, Commencement is held on the front lawn of the campus. The land itself was part of a farm purchased by the college's trustees through a gift from Philadelphia banker and philanthropist Charles Macalester. The Commencement podium completed in 2017 by Conrad Adelmann, a carpenter from Facilities Services, recycles wood from one of the college's yellow locust trees.

On this land, the trustees built Old Main. The east wing (since removed for construction of the DeWitt Wallace Library) was completed first at a cost of about \$25,000 and housed the entire college when it opened officially on September 16, 1885. Macalester's founder, the Rev. Edward Duffield Neill, gave the main dedication address to 5 professors, 6 freshmen, and 52 preparatory students from the Baldwin School. The west wing of Old Main (the portion still standing) was constructed for about \$100,000 in 1887; its exterior was refurbished in 1985 and its interior in 1993.

The DeWitt Wallace Library, opened in the fall of 1988, provides more than 800 seats in individual and group settings, houses 350,000 volumes, and provides access to over 75,000 electronic journals and more than 16 million ebooks. Through our interlibrary lending services our community has access to resources in libraries throughout the world. A renovation in 2017 created additional study and teaching spaces, an Idea Lab, and a teaching space dedicated to our Archives/Rare Books collections. Alumni and friends contribute to the maintenance of the library and our collections.

Outside the DeWitt Wallace Library is the Marvin Plaza, dedicated to Margaret Wallin Marvin '39. Margaret Wallin Marvin was a committed friend to the college, a Macalester Distinguished Citizen, former trustee, and devoted grandmother of Macalester alumni. The plaza incorporates porous paving stones in the pattern of the Macalester shield.

To the west of Old Main is Carnegie Hall, built in 1910 through a gift from philanthropist Andrew Carnegie. Once home to Macalester's science programs, Carnegie now houses the social science departments.

South of Carnegie is the Janet Wallace Fine Arts Center, a gift of DeWitt Wallace '11 and Lila Acheson Wallace, founders of *Reader's Digest*. The center was named for Mr. Wallace's mother, who was the wife of Dr. James Wallace, an influential long-term faculty member who served as Macalester's fifth president from 1894 to 1906. The Janet Wallace Fine Arts Center includes the Theater and Dance Building, the Music Building, and the Joan Adams Mondale Hall of Studio Art. Full renovation and expansions of the Music and Studio Art Buildings were completed in 2014. The new Theater and Dance Building opened in 2019. It equips students with cutting-edge resources and technology, expanded studios, and a flexible theater space. In addition, the building includes 11 multi-use classrooms for faculty and students across all disciplines.

South of the Janet Wallace Fine Arts Center is the Humanities Building, which was renamed in 2013 to honor the Rev. Edward Duffield Neill, founder and first president of Macalester. In November 2019, the Macalester Board of Trustees voted to return to the building's original name based on the discovery of extreme, racist writings that stand out even within an historical context. The Board is establishing a committee, with appropriate membership from all college constituencies, to recommend a new name for the building, and to recognize Neill's accomplishments and his deep flaws in some way other than through the naming of a building. Construction of the Humanities Building was completed in 1965.

The Olin-Rice Science Center, fully renovated in 1997, provides space for science classes as well as state-of-the-art laboratories built to accommodate research training, extensive student-faculty research collaboration projects, and cooperative research across disciplines.

The college's athletic facilities are to the east of the Janet Wallace Fine Arts Center and extend south to St. Clair Avenue. The Leonard Center, a 175,000-square-foot athletic and wellness complex, was completed in 2008. It houses facilities for fitness and wellness programs as well as training and competition. The Leonard Center is named for the late George P. Leonard '27 and his wife Wilma Fox Leonard '27, along with their family, longtime supporters of Macalester.

Directly east of Old Main is Kirk Hall, which houses about 150 students. It is named for Robert A. Kirk, who was a longtime Macalester trustee.

North of Kirk is the Ruth Stricker Dayton Campus Center. Completed in 2001, the center is named in honor of the late Ruth Stricker Dayton '57, who served as a trustee for many years and was awarded the Alumni Association's 1987 Distinguished Citizen citation for her work in health and wellness. Outside the main entrance is the Bateman Plaza, a gathering place named for the late Warren Bateman '44, a trustee of the college from 1996 to 2006.

The Weyerhaeuser Memorial Chapel is an ecumenical place of worship. The hexagonal glass-walled structure was dedicated in 1969. It was a gift of the family of Frederick Weyerhaeuser, a trustee of the college from 1957 until his death in 1961.

Immediately in front of the chapel, the circular Memorial Garden provides a special location for plaques in memory of individuals close to the college. At its center, the college flies the United States flag, accompanied since 1950 by the United Nations flag.

West of the chapel is Weyerhaeuser Hall, named in memory of Rudolph M. Weyerhaeuser, a longtime member of the Board of Trustees. Built as the college library in 1942 and expanded in 1960, the facility in 1989 was converted to administrative offices, freeing other space for classrooms and faculty offices.

To the north across Grand Avenue are several buildings named after prominent members of the Macalester community. The newest is Markim Hall. It is the home of the Kofi Annan Institute for Global Citizenship, named in honor of Mark Stricker and Kimberly Stricker-Griffin '87, son and daughter of trustee and benefactor Ruth Stricker Dayton '57.

Other buildings north of Grand Avenue are Bigelow Hall, named for brothers Charles H. and Frederick R. Bigelow, who between them chaired the Board of Trustees from 1925 to 1946; Wallace Hall, named in honor of faculty member and president James Wallace; Doty Hall, named for Margaret MacGregor Doty, a Macalester graduate of 1914 and dean of women 1924–60; Dupre Hall, named for J. Huntley Dupre, professor of history 1946–64 and dean of the college 1951–61; Kagin Commons, named in honor of Edwin Kagin, religion professor 1926–52, and renovated in 2002; Turck Hall, a residence hall named for Charles J. Turck, president of the college 1939–58; Briggs House, a gathering space for events and college guests, named for longtime manager Mary Kay Briggs; and George Draper Dayton Hall, dedicated in 1998, named for the department store founder who became a Macalester trustee in 1894; many members of the Dayton family have served on the board since then.

IN MEMORIAM

The colorful floral arrangement on the stage at this year's Grad Walk programs honors those people who began this journey with our graduates and who are not here with us now. Today we remember Kai (Khalid Malik) Davis and Conor Tomlin, members of the Class of 2021.

ACADEMIC DRESS AND CUSTOMS

Academic dress stems from the Middle Ages, when scholars were also clerics and wore the costume of the monastic order. The hood was originally a cowl attached to the gown; it could be slipped over the head for warmth. The cap, originally round, later became a square mortarboard.

On appropriate occasions, anyone with a college or university degree may wear academic dress. By observing the style of each costume, one often may identify the university, the degree held, and the field of major interest.

The long, pointed sleeve of the gown indicates a bachelor's degree, the closed sleeve with a slit near the upper part of the arm indicates a master's degree. Bachelors' and masters' gowns are black and have no trim.

The doctor's gown is usually black, but some universities prescribe other colors. All doctors' gowns have velvet trim on the front facings and crossbars on the sleeves. This trim may be black, or may match the edging of the hood.

The color of the velvet edging on the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted. It should be noted that the doctoral degree often earned is the PhD, or doctor of philosophy, in a given subject. The academic costume then displays the color of philosophy, dark blue, rather than the color of the specific subject.

The colors associated with specific subjects are as follows:

ABOUT THE COLLEGE SEAL

The seal of Macalester College, which appears on the cover of this booklet, was devised by Macalester's founder, the Rev. Edward Duffield Neill. In a sermon preached before the Presbyterian Synod of Minnesota in September 1873, he explained its significance:

"On the corporate seal of the institution are engraved two female figures, one in classic drapery, telescope in hand and compass at the feet, representing Science investigating the laws of Nature; the other in sitting posture and modern dress holding open the word of God, representing Revelation. They are in friendly converse, the twin sisters of Heaven, as the motto suggests, 'Natura et Revelatio, coeli gemini.'"

After the college became a synodical institution, the Trustees adopted the seal on October 19, 1881.
