- 4. Non Tenure-Track Faculty Voting Rights reviewed message from FPC. We had an extensive discussion of the 10% rule and learned that there is no cap on tenure-track faculty. There is a cap because of budget, but not because of a set number. This will be shared at the faculty meeting on Tuesday. We also learned we have added 17 tenure-track lines over the past 10 years. After discussion it was decided we would defer a discussion of voting rights until after a collection of views from faculty can be done in early spring semester.
