- 4. Discussion of Enrollment Imbalances: We talked about the language we use around "liberal arts" and that term being inclusive of all that we offer. We want the FAIR to be productive and positive experience where we come to common ground around institutional values. We want to be sure that broad suggestions for programming the FAIR are welcome. What are the anticipated outcomes? Perhaps, a community understanding of the "liberal arts", a common vocabulary, a common set of facts; also an opportunity to have the kinds of conversations we have in EPAG. Most important might be to foster a culture of trust and respect. Could this be a chance to talk about a more institutional spirit rather than an academic specialty spirit? What is the relation between Macalester's values (as evidenced by requirements) and what's happening in the world. Much other valuable discussion about the confidence we have in our students and their futures.
- 5. Environmental Studies Review: ES has responded to the reviewer's report. Darcy is drafting our response.
