This is due to 4 of the history tenure-track faculty being gone for one year. The draft response was approved and Dan will send out next week.
- 4. Response to International Development Concentration Review reviewed draft response and had brief discussion about overlap with Int'l Development, African Studies and Food and Agriculture Studies. Most see these concentrations as providing roadmaps for those interested. Folks should review Dan's draft and let him know before Monday if you see a need for any changes.
- 5. Critical Theory will be discussed next week.
