- b. Departmental Review Policy (Eric) We discussed at what point does a department review end and what kind of action can be taken if there are questions about a department response. The Handbook refers to a summary by the Provost and report to the Board after the external review process is completed. So it was expressed that EPAG felt the Provost has final oversight for resolving any lingering issues.
- 7. Mobilize Mac Project Proposal (Eric) Discussion of proposal to create a space for students to engage in political action by providing credit for internships, practicum, specific course, etc. for the 2020 election. Discussed structures already in place and a program Occidental College has in place. What can our students learn from being engaged in the election? Is there a possibility for a combination of practicum and seminar. Conversation to continue. No final decision.
