How do I apply?

Online applications are available at the Graduate School website. They are due on January 15. You will also need GRE scores, undergraduate transcripts, recommendation letters, and your statement of purpose.

Which GRE test should I take?

You should take the general test which has three parts, Verbal, Quantitative, and Analytical Writing.

Do graduates of this program find teaching jobs?

Over the past 8 years, 100% of graduates from this program have accepted a teaching position.

How much will it cost?

Students are eligible for a partial tuition scholarship, approximately 80% of the Wake Forest Graduate School tuition.

Who will teach and mentor me?

All courses, including the student teaching internship, are conducted and supervised by department faculty, not teaching assistants.
