Events to Commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire

Many events to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire will take place in the Twin Cities in March, April and May. Peter Rachleff is working with Jewish Community Action, the "Untold Stories" project of the Friends of the Saint Paul Public Library, and the University of Minnesota's Immigration History Research Center to organize these events. The purpose of this commemoration is to make connections between the experiences of southern, central, and eastern European immigrants of the early 20th century and those of the new immigrants from Latin, Central and Southern America, Russia, China and south and southeast Asia, and west and east Africa in our midst today. Summer Travel-study Opportunity for Students in Poland

Christine Manganaro, who taught some courses in the history department last year alerted us to this opportunity for students to participate in an 18-day trip to Poland this summer to, along-side working artists, help construct and paint an 85% scale replica of one of the no-longer-existing Jewish synagogues that were common to Poland prior to WWII, and ultimately help produce a permanent museum installation at the Museum of the History of Polish Jews in Warsaw. The program is focused on art and craft, history, technology, and learning by doing. Credit is available for the course through Mass Art, but is not required.
