

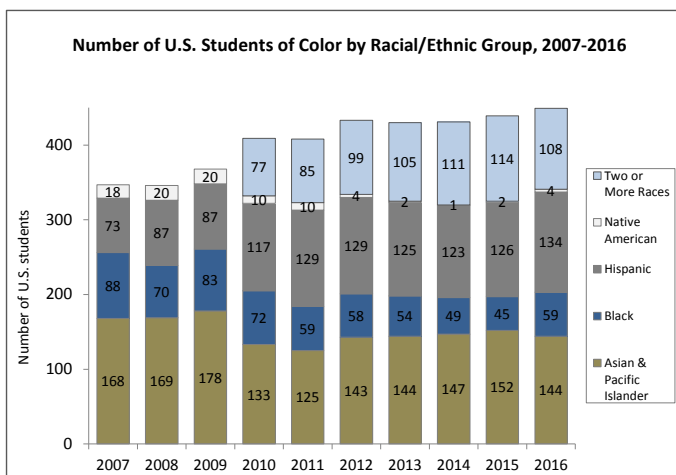

Many Macalester students of color identify with more than one race/ethnic category. This table recognizes students of color in EACH of the race/ethnic categories (other than white) with which they self-identify. As a result, this table double or triple counts students who identify with more than one of the nonwhite race/ethnic categories used by the U.S. Census.
