


Over the summer, all incoming first-year students are asked to complete the homegrown Macalester First-Year Survey (92% response rate). One question asks for open-ended responses to the following: **"Please tell us what a successful experience at Mac would look like for you."** Responses to this question from incoming 2023 first-year students have been content analyzed by theme. Theme frequencies and illustrative quotes are displayed below to help paint a picture of the multifaceted nature of incoming students' perceptions of success.

Relationships, Connections, & Community



73% of first-year students said a successful Macalester experience would include **building relationships/connections** and **finding community/support** among students, faculty, and staff at Mac.

Find Vocation, Purpose, Career Experience



56% of first-year students said a successful Macalester career would include finding and pursuing their purpose and interests and career development opportunities

Gain Knowledge & Academic Success



50% of first-year students said a successful Macalester career would include **academic success, taking engaging classes,** and **gaining knowledge** broadly and in a field.



Personal Development, Growth




Growing, meeting people from different backgrounds and encountering new experiences is an important aspect of a successful Macalester experience for 34% of first-year students

40% of first-year students report that finding friends in the Mac community and having a healthy social life is a worry for them.

| Social Life / Finding Friends or community / Fitting in | I am mostly concerned about fitting in with a group of people that are most likely very different from the people I am used to I'm worried about my ability to socialize and balance that with my school work. I hope that I can make friends and I won't feel lonely and isolated. The biggest concern I have going into Mac is being able to manage my social life and academic life. Sometimes I'm very social but sometimes I'm not so it makes it hard to meet people. So meeting others and joining the community is a large concern for me. |
| Adapting to new culture / language / environment / Predominantly White Institution (PWI) | My biggest concern is adapting to the culture of a new country and place. I am also a bit concerned about having a roommate. I'm used to having my own space where I can decompress alone, so it will be a big adjustment to live with another person. Overwhelmingly white population in St. Paul |
| Cold Minnesota Weather | I am not accustomed to the cold weather in Minnesota. Therefore, I am worried that I will get seasonal depression, and my mental health will go downhill. the weather is something that scares me |
| Homesickness / Lack of Family Support/ Living on one's own | My biggest concerns is mainly just the transition from living so far away from my home and family/friends I am very scared to be away from my family. |
| Balancing everything / Time Management / Being overwhelmed | I am most concerned about my time management. My biggest concern is my poor time management and the self-esteem issues/insecurity/shame that goes along with it (and it's hard to tell which came first) Not taking on too much because a lot of the new experiences will be super exciting so I have to make sure I'm able to say no. |
| Stress / mental and physical health | I guess my biggest concern would be managing stress and these new struggles I'm having with anxiety while living so far away from home. getting overly stressed by responsibilities. |

Finances, Student Debt



10% of first-year students are worried about finances during college and/or student debt after college

| Finding Vocation / right major / knowing what I want to pursue Choosing a major that later on I wish I hadn't chosen. I know that nothing's truly a mistake in terms of what major/s I decide on but I don't want to realize I wasted a lot of money and should have taken a different route in terms of what career I end up going into. Finally, my overall anxiety that I have about the future would be my biggest concern in the sense that my anxiety might cause me to freeze up. 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| College expenses / living expenses / post-college debt | I also worry about money and work while in college is advantageous or vice-versa. Not being able to pay the rest of my remaining tuition cost and having lots of debt I worry that my the financial situation at home might come between a lot of things while I'm away from home. I know that in the coming year our finances will be more of a struggle and it's stressful to try and think of how we will be able to afford certain things (ex. plane tickets home or any necessities) on top of tuition or supplies. |
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
