

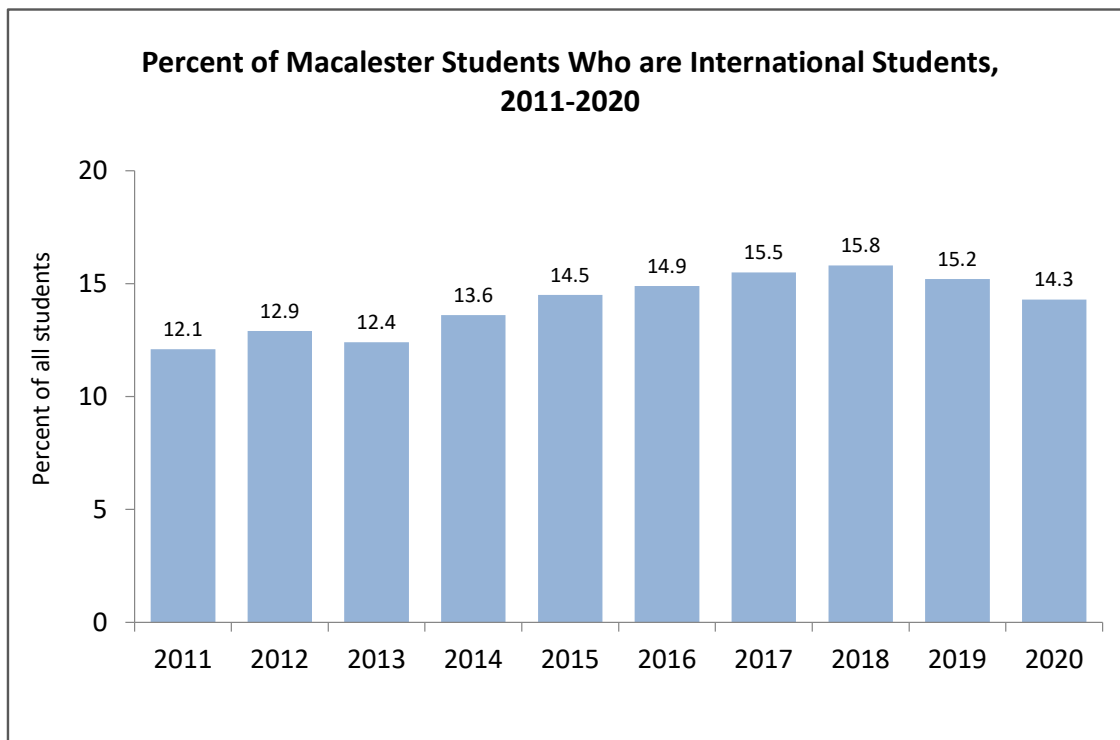

NOTE: Permanent residents of U.S. are counted as U.S. citizens, not as international students. U.S. citizens with dual citizenship are counted as U.S. citizens. Beginning in 2015, when international students have citizenship in two countries, both countries are counted.

*Starting fall 2017, students are able to self-report 'nonbinary' as their official institutionally-recognized gender.
