## Mobile Phone Systems In The USA

As of December 2022, GSM and CDMA have been shut down by all US carriers thereby discontinuing 2G/3G data connectivity.
You can still use unlocked GSM and CDMA phones and get a physical SIM card.

## eSIM

You could also get an eSIM which is a digital version of the physical SIM card. Convenient because you can't lose it, and you don't have to wait for it to arrive in the mail.
Most phones are eligible for an eSIM.
Exceptions: Phones purchased in China, very old phones (link for supported devices), some MVNO carriers (link for supported MVNO carriers)

## Types of Wireless Service Providers

| Providers |  | Comments |

| Carrier | There are three main carriers that run their own network - <br> Verizon, AT\&T and T-Mobile. | More stable in highly crowded areas. But <br> more expensive than MVNOs. |
| MVNO | MVNOs are carriers that don't have their own wireless network; <br> instead, they piggyback off another carrier's platform for <br> coverage through their cell phone plans. | Cheaper and usually more options of <br> plans. Most of them are fairly stable <br> around campus. |

## Types of plans

| Type of <br> plan | How it works | Advantages | Disadvantages |

| Pre-paid <br> plan | You "refill" your phone plan <br> monthly, quarterly or <br> annually without which you <br> don't get service. | You don't have to commit to a <br> contract, which means you can <br> stop refilling your plan <br> whenever you are out of the <br> country. | Individual <br> contract | Usually 1 or 2 year contract <br> with early termination fee, <br> monthly bill, and option to <br> buy phones at discount <br> prices. This is not very <br> common anymore. | Usually cheaper in the long <br> run, you can usually get a <br> device for free or heavily <br> discounted. | You have to commit for at least 12 <br> months, requiring cash flow to pay <br> every month. | Payment <br> Plan | You pay a monthly bill for <br> access to a certain amount of <br> talk, text and data. | Most of these plans include <br> unlimited talk and text. | You may or may not get the full <br> advantage of the plan depending on <br> how heavy of a phone user you are. |

You also share your <br> data/minutes which can be <br> unbalanced. |
| Unlimited <br> Plan | You pay a monthly bill for <br> unlimited talk, text and data. | Don't need to worry about <br> limits. | Expensive. Need to be a heavy phone <br> user to get the most out of this plan. |

## Installing a Landline Phone

Before you get a mobile phone plan, you may get a landline for your room from Macalester ITS. (Mac requires a phone number in your student record, otherwise there is a registration hold.) so that your mentors can reach you (http://its-notices-alerts.blogspot.com/2013/05/11-things-students-should-know-about.html). You can call anywhere in the Twin Cities with this phone, free of charge.

## Notes:

1. Don't ask your host family to join their family plan (that's rude). If they make the offer, that's great.
2. Most phones sold in the U.S. are locked to the carrier that sells them, so you couldn't take a GSM iPhone from AT\&T and use it on T-Mobile's network unless the phone is unlocked. However, many Verizon smartphones come unlocked.
3. On that note, there is also an option to unlock your phone after a certain period of time (for example, 9 months with AT\&T). Consult your phone company for the detailed policies.
4. Each carrier has options for voice, text, or data that gives you a certain amount of usage and fees for when you go over your limits. If you are not on unlimited voice or text plan, US carriers may charge you for outgoing and incoming call minutes or texts.
5. To check a coverage map, enter in Mac's zip code - 55105.
6. Plans change often so check the carrier's website for updated costs and information.
7. Most plans offer the ability to set up autopay to automatically pay for the bill. This typically comes with a discount and means you don't have to worry about remembering to pay every month.
