- Provost's Student Advisory Committee
 - Hi I'm Felicia, sophomore, she/her pronouns
 - I'm Lizzy she/her, junior
 - Isabella, she/her, first year
 - There's one other person who's currently studying away
 - Basically what we do is every month we meet with the Provost and we bring up issues that we've found in our communities on campus and questions or issues, general things of concerns of the student body and we talk to her about it, she responds at a meeting, sometimes sends us an email
 - Sometimes she has questions about what the student body feels about things
 - Small sample of student body that meets with her for around an hour and we chat

Eric: Are there issues you can share with us that you've discussed? Felicia:

- Talked about a wide range of things; students who want an ice skating rink on campus, students not happy with textbook prices
- Can vary based on what we've been hearing or experiencing, what we've seen at Mac

Lizzy:

- She does a really got job of laying out structures of power, things that fall out of her jurisdiction
- Some stuff things that you guys have been working on, that the college is aware of, want to reiterate what students are feeling

Felicia:

- Last year talked a lot about mental health, want more resources, students want wellness days,
- As students that meet with her, she knows that these are still concerns, reiterating these issues, making sure she's hearing them from multiple angles

Mathilda

• Any things that have resulted from these conversations? Felicia

- I was sick for the last meeting but I talked to her about creating more
 - positive campus culture around winter, which I think is a huge issue
- Want to be more positive about it
- There were a few events like that
- If you have any issues she should hear about, shoot us an email
- If you have anything you would want us to bring up shoot us an email Tristan
 - What are ways you directly communicate with the student body, getting more student input? Ideas? Done anything?

Response: we have not but that is a very good idea Austin

• Just want to say that if there is any way we can help you that is useful, just let us know, want to make it easier for you all to get student issues to the provost

Austin: awesome

- Macalester Dining Advisory Committee

Alec

- We are MDAC or Macalester Dining Advisory Committee
- We aren't the only students but the ones here today
- Want to focus on two big things we've focused on throughout the year
- Specifically we've focused on sustainability and dietary restrictions
- Sustainability: working with Sustainability Office on Race to Zero Waste
- Evaluate how much waste the college produces relative to other colleges
 - Macalester dining 3.0, 2.0, not sure
 - Been doing pretty well compared to other colleges
 - In the top 5 range in amount of food recycled because of animal farm, measure the amount of waste that goes in and goes out
- Also been focusing on reducing the amount of beef offerings, increasing plant-based
 - Lot of tempeh, reduced amount of burgers but increased number of burger specials
 - Reduces amount of beef but ensures consumer base is satisfied

Anneke

- More options for students with dietary restrictions
- Working with CRSL for more options for students with Passover and Ramadan, more halal and kosher options, more options for students with dietary restrictions and food allergies
 - More gluten free, vegan, vegetarian options
- Get cafe mac to give wider range of options for students with food restrictions
- Having special food days ot increase student engagement
- Ingredient spotlight days
- Black history month celebrating plant-based cuisine, working on planning more events like that
 - One for Earth day which is coming up next month

- Most sustainable food practices come from Indigenous cultures
 - Have you had conversations about that when sourcing food?

Anneke

• We have not

Alec

- Yes
- Well not specifically Indigenous, talk about a variety of food providers
- Bon Appetit has the farm to fork initiative, tries to ensure local producers are nearby and at least take a certain percentage of our food from them

• I don't know if there's specifically an Indigenous farm in the works

Anneke

• We haven't specifically talked about Indigenous practices but talked about how Bon Appetit tries to locally source things

Eric

- Is meal swipe and how that system works on the committee's radar at all?
- Like just how meal swipe transfers for student

Alec

- We had a brief discussion of reducing the cost for the meal plan to ensure flexibility because not all people want to meal swipe in a certain amount of times
- Bon Appetit says that's what the commuter's plan is for
 - Had a discussion on the change
 - It won't-it's not going to happen in the next year

• This is really really low on the priority list but has there been talk about getting quesadillas back on the grill option? Has that been brought up?

Alec

- There has been talk; I know that Bon Appetit has been changing the way they've done the grille, has made it harder for them to do this
 - Have heard a lot about quesadillas

• We have both representatives here, they will be leading

Men of Color Collective Representative

- Hi my name's Victor Wright, senior, he/him
- Myself along with three others are all current facilitators for the Men of Color Collective
- We're trying to bring it back to the Macalester community
- We were a student initiative that was part of the DML, kind of lost traction because of Covid
- Viable part of our experience here at Macalester
- Before my class graduated, wanted to bring it back because we were the last group that formally got to be a part of this organization
- Want to give it a bit more structure, resources so it can prosper and folks down the line can continue with this organization
- We can talk about membership; Macalester outlined that we can't be discriminating along any identities, don't anticipate doing so
- Plan to promote our membership, open up membership, on Macalester resources
- Intend for events to be open to anyone want this to be a resource that will provide resources to Macalester community, targeted community
- On Sunday began doing recruiting, posted on social media, asking people to complete a google form to allow them to become official members
- Plan to do a social media photoshoot, introducing members, plan to do recruiting during the school year, folks will become more interested and every event we'll open our doors to anyone who's interested
- Membership removal: anything along the lines of conduct, want to emphasize calling people in rather than calling people out
- Don't want to perpetuate toxic cancel culture but there are times when people need to be removed, want to have a talk with people who need to be removed, how they will or will not be moving forward with this organization
- Operate on a horizontal leadership method, not hierarchical, all facilitators, want to allow for flexibility, want to be supporting one another in personal

lives, want to be able to step back when need to, to make sure that whenever someone needs to focus on athletics, school or family matters

- Also have this thing that is unique about facilitators' responsibility post-grad
 - Want to emphasize networking, want to have people maintain relationships with the club past graduation to allow for networking, want to make sure that once you leave this space you're able to stay connected

- Resignation: pretty straightforward

- Currently our advisor is Sedric, every year planning on asking someone else good enough to work with the student or
 - Facilitators will host 4-6 meetings per month, doesn't include social events
 - Want to make sure people are proactively involved
- Finances: still trying to become a student org so we don't have very many [finances] to deal with, facilitators deal with one member of board, once funding granted anticipate that facilitators will decide what to do with the money
- Anyone is allowed to propose an amendment to our current charter, open to official members and officiating board

Abbey

- Hi I'm Abbey Kamin
- I work in Mac Fund, assistant director

Michael

- he/him, sophomore
- I'm a student supervisor for Mac Fund outreach center
- Do calling for alumni, fundraising
- I've been working with Abbey to provide student insights and doing other stuff

Abbey

- He is THE student supervisor
- We'll talk about Give to Macalester Day or GTMD, little acronym
- Starts tomorrow, goes through Friday, annual fundraising campaign and used to be one day, last year we tried 5 days, a little long, this year we're trying 3 days; biggest push for fundraising, offer matches to increase donors

Michael

- Go over what GTMD achieved last year since I was one of the people pretty heavily involved
- Last year our goal was 2000 donors in 5 days, got 2190 donors to give to macalester during the 5 day period
- Got 49 states except for Kansas
- If anyone knows anyone from Kansas let us know, we'll call them and text them

- Total amount of money donate: \$878,163 that includes \$200,000 from the board of trustees for breaking 2000 donors mark
- All money raised last year, this year goes to student experience at Macalester
- Different designations
- Different places you can donate
- You can click other, can fundraise or donate to specific major, specific athletic team, donate to specific student orgs
- Student org donations aren't tax-deductible
- Goal again is 2000 donors
- Focus more on donor number than money because important to get everyone involved
- GTMD is one big day a year
- We really try to fundraise for Macalester fund, major chunk of fundraising
- All of that money goes into things you do everyday
- Like Macalester connect trips, Michael has gone on

Michael

- Really hits home, Bobbie went on a trip to DC, funded by alumni donations
- Initiatives that can only be funded using alumni donation money, remind people about giving to Macalester and getting in that habit
- If not happening, if missing money then 24 less students would have the opportunity to attend macalester
- Mac continuing mission of accessible education for underrepresented people
- Talking about professors, anyone here taking classes from departments that are really understaffed?
- Would be like taking 3 professors away, eradicating a whole department from Macalester
- Goes into funding for classes, 180 less spots for classes at Mac, would mean less money to offer classes or hold classes at Mac
- Thinking about for some departments, overcrowding of classes, effects quality of education

• All in all, those numbers put into context how important holding GTMD is

Abbey

- Reading crucial for Macalester slide
- Want to cultivate sense of philanthropy
- How can you all help, we're here to tell you
- A lot of things you can do
- Very big social media campaign with regular Macalester social media campaign, you can share on social media, post, share how your Mac experience has been and why you love it here, can see stuff in the Mac daily, spent a lot of time and effort

- On Thursday is on-campus day, from 8 am to 5 pm we'll have a hub in the Campus Center, from 8-? have a hub in the LC, can win prizes
- I'll be spinning cotton candy, if you want it at 8:30 in the morning you can get it, we're starting it then
- Having a little building competition, building a structure that we have on campus, can enter to win two Lego prizes that I kind of want to win but I can't because I set it up so that's a little bit awkward

Michael

- For current students if you donate at least \$5 we'll automatically match \$100 from board of trustees, sounds like a retirement plan as I always say
- Addressing a lot of student issues, general climate of student body, I believe that financial wise if we have strong finances for MCSG solutions will come quicker

Abbey

- The one day you can turn \$5 into \$105; donor gets to choose the organization money goes into
- The \$5 goes into the organization but the matching fund goes into the support-it-all fund

• Matches go into wherever the donor specifies as well, just to make it clear Austin

- Thanks so much for coming, I was a class agent last year
- \$5 does turn into \$105 and that's super cool, I don't know anywhere else in the world that can happen
