- Bottom 20% about 4.6 which is pretty substantive
- Little bit of a demographic of who we have as a population
- What did we do? Set up some interviews with low income students

- Made a list of what people's complaints and thoughts were for how things get handed
- What happened after Macalester tuition, not the tuition itself
- Created some goals for what we wanted to look at
- Collaborate with residential life about winter housing, Bobbie has done a lot of work with that
- Hopefully we can get more winter housing especially for international students really hard to go home and come back
- Want to give people housing all the way through winter break
- Textbooks, textbooks extremely expensive
- Still very much expensive
- Fully stocked food pantry
- Allergies don't have an income bracket, anyone can have allergies that's the thing
- Complaints from all over the school from people having allergies and not being able to access food
- For now what we want to focus on, with collaboration from other advisory committees more we want to accomplish

• We have already read most of this, this is a slightly updated version that I wanted to add in a couple important data points from the library's textbook survey which contrary to beliefs of some was not done by me and I had no part in the contribution of

- I made the ask clear, have it bolded in section 1 [read bolded ask]
- Rationale is that it would increase the amount a student pays by around \$160 before factoring in how it would be absorbed by financial aid process
- Second ask is to collaborate on an alternative
- I and all of my colleagues believe approving this would increase corporate control

• Would Macalester bill all of us or would Barnes and Noble bill all of us

Joel

- We don't really know, based on talking to Brian Lindeman last AAC meeting, neither does anyone else
- My guess is it would look like the iteration of textbook billing that was offered Fall of 2021 but also we don't know exactly
- The gist of it is that increasing the amount of money students have to pay in textbooks by a lot and reasons to seek out more sustainable textbook options is bad and unfaithful for what the school's stated goals of supporting open education resources are as well as MCSG's support for these things and of course our support for the amount we spend on textbook reserve above the median family income of a Macalester student
- I can take a while unpacking the different facets of it although we saw a previous iteration of it

Bobbie

• Questions for Joel? People who weren't at last few LB meetings where this was brought up, if you have questions like "what the hell is this" that's fine

Joel

- This is pretty in the weeds with textbook policy
- I'd love to get that question
- Really quickly currently we have an agreement with Barnes and Noble
- They are a bookstore
- Professors submit materials pretty early at a price and can chose to buy materials at the bookstore or get them somewhere else
- Median Fall 2022 textbook spending was \$120
- Would increase to \$320 to \$412 dollars a semester depending on the price, is what Barnes and Noble has offered to the school
- Would make all students automatically pay the fee, at least \$200 higher than what average student pays
- No market control on students for how much textbooks cost

- Currently have students finding different ways to get textbooks, like textbook reserve,
- Students crafty at spending less money on textbooks
- This is Barnes and Noble's response to that, would let them consolidate their response
- That's it, read the whole thing you want it says the whole thing in better more eloquent words
