

Visiting Faculty in Economics

The Macalester College Department of Economics invites applications for non-tenure-track visiting positions for the 2024-25 academic year. We seek candidates with strong commitment to high quality undergraduate teaching in any field of economics. While the area of expertise is open, teaching expectations will include core introductory level courses with opportunities to teach topics courses in the economist's areas of interest. The teaching load is four courses per year with a maximum of three course preparations. ABD candidates will be considered; however, they must have their degree in hand prior to August 2024. Visa sponsorship is not available for this position. Salary and benefits are competitive.

For full consideration, submit electronic copies of your cover letter, curriculum vitae, teaching statement, evidence of teaching effectiveness, and three letters of recommendation to https://academicjobsonline.org/ajo/jobs/26983. The teaching statement should include a discussion of past experiences and/or thoughts contributing to diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives in teaching.
