

Part-time Visiting Assistant Professor or Instructor in Geospatial Science

Saint Paul, Minnesota -- Applications are invited for a part-time non-tenure-track visiting assistant professor or visiting instructor position in geospatial sciences to begin in fall 2024. ABD or Ph.D. in Geography or a cognate discipline is preferred and we welcome applications from individuals with a Master's degree in a field relevant to Geography. The department is searching for a part-time instructor to teach one or two geography courses during the 2024-25 academic year. The successful candidate will teach one or two courses in the candidate's areas of expertise that complement the existing strengths of the department. Candidates must be able to teach a course in advanced geospatial techniques (including, for example, remote sensing or applied GIS). We welcome applicants who could also teach a physical geography course. A strong commitment to liberal arts education, experiential learning, and undergraduate research activities is essential. We prefer candidates who can offer courses in the fall 2024 semester. Visa sponsorship is not available for this position. Salary and benefits are competitive.
