Visiting Faculty in Environmental Studies Ecology

The Macalester College Department of Environmental Studies invites applications for a five course (1.0FTE) non-tenure-track visiting position in Ecology. We seek applicants who are committed to excellence in teaching at the undergraduate level. Areas of research specialization might include aquatic ecology, agroecology, biogeochemistry, and/or urban ecology, ideally in the context of addressing environmental inequities and/or climate change, adaptation and resilience. Candidates for this position could employ a range of research methods depending on their field of expertise. ABD candidates will be considered. Visa sponsorship is not available for this position. In addition, candidates relying on an OPT Visa with a STEM extension are not eligible for hire.

For over fifty years, Macalester has had a dedicated and deeply interdisciplinary focus on Environmental Studies. We use case studies, problem-solving, and a community-centered approach to address environmental problems at the local, national and global levels. Our core faculty bring expertise from the humanities, social sciences, physical, and biological sciences. Our affiliated faculty come from all corners of campus, including anthropology, biology, chemistry, economics, education, geography, geology, and physics. The successful candidate would have the option to teach our required introductory course Ecology and the Environment, as well as other courses at a variety of levels of the curriculum; we welcome candidates who can cross-list courses in other departments and college-wide concentrations.

The cover letter should include a statement of interest in Macalester and the Environmental Studies Department. Strong candidates will have experience and vision regarding teaching and mentorship of students of diverse backgrounds with attention to structural barriers that limit access to educational opportunities.

In addition to the cover letter, applications should include:

- Curriculum vitae
- Teaching and Research Statement
- Candidates should be prepared to provide two letters of reference by Monday, Feb. 16, if requested

Teaching and Research Statement should include:

- Teaching philosophy and statement of effective strategies for teaching and learning;
- Commitment to teaching, advising, and mentoring undergraduate students, including students from diverse backgrounds;
- Research specialization within Ecology
- Prior experience with Ecology teaching and coursework

Compensation and Benefits:

The starting salary range for this position will be \$60,000-65,000 and will depend upon teaching experience and highest degree attained.
