The Macalester College Department of Art and Art History invites applications for a three-course-equivalent (.58FTE) non-tenure-track visiting position in the 2026-2027 academic year. The successful candidate will teach the second half of two four-credit Fall 2026 term courses ("Sculpture 1" and "Soft Sculpture and the Fiber Arts") and two four-credit courses ("Sculpture 1" and "3D Design") in the Spring 2027 term. The fall courses have set days and times of MWF 9:40-11:40am and MW 1:10-4:20pm, and the position would begin in mid to late October 2026. The days and times of the spring semester classes have yet to be scheduled, and there will be some flexibility for the successful candidate.

A terminal degree (MFA) in a 3D studio art field is required. Visa sponsorship is not available for this position. In addition, candidates relying on an OPT Visa with a STEM extension are not eligible for hire.

Compensation and Benefits:

The starting salary range for this position will be \$26,000-\$27,000 and will depend upon teaching experience and highest degree attained.

All visiting faculty members will have access to the athletics fitness facility, wellness coaching, and campus activities.
