Assistant Professor Behavioral Economics

The Department of Economics at Macalester College invites applications for a full-time tenure track position at the Assistant Professor level to begin in the 2027-28 academic year. We seek candidates with teaching and research interests in Behavioral Economics. Macalester College values a strong commitment to research, a promise of successful scholarly engagement, and dedication to teaching excellence in a liberal arts environment. A Ph.D. degree is expected by August 2027.

At Macalester College, diversity, equity, and inclusion are central to our educational mission and values. We are committed to the institutional change required for visioning and realizing a more equitable and socially just college and society. In this spirit, we pride ourselves on our inclusive curriculum and pedagogy (e.g. active learning, real world applications, early engagement in research).

Macalester also provides an attractive environment for economists. We offer a vibrant, engaged and collegial environment in the heart of the Twin Cities. We currently offer the largest single major on campus, and have a track record of exceptional undergraduate research collaboration. Macalester faculty teach five semester course sections per year (typically two to three distinct courses), supervise honors theses, maintain an active scholarly agenda, and engage in departmental activities. During their first year, new faculty teach four courses and attend a weekly new faculty development seminar.

2. Job market paper,
3. Graduate school transcripts (no GPA requirement),
4. Three letters of recommendation – at least one of which discusses your potential as a teacher,
5. Teaching statement: a statement of your experience in, commitment to, and vision for teaching undergraduate students. Discuss pedagogical approaches (e.g., inclusive

teaching, active and innovative teaching strategies, assessment of learning outcomes), future teaching development goals, and courses you'd be passionate to teach or introduce into the curriculum,

6. A cover letter (2-3 pages) that provides an executive summary of your:
 - a. specific interest in joining the Economics Department at Macalester College,
 - b. training and experience in Economics or a closely related field,
 - c. contributions to the scholarly field and future research goals,
 - d. demonstrated activity and commitment to inclusive pedagogies, scholarship, service, and/or community engagement;
 - e. experience and vision regarding teaching, advising, and mentorship of students with a variety of experiences and backgrounds with attention to students who experience structural barriers and limited access to educational opportunities.

Application materials should be written to be accessible to all members of the search committee (including Economics and non-Economics faculty and undergraduate students), as well as the college Provost and Dean of the Faculty.

The starting salary range for this position will be \$99,000-\$102,000, depending on experience. If the candidate is an advanced assistant candidate, salary would be above this range and based on internal equity. At Macalester, we offer a generous package of employee benefits. - 10% employer contributions to the retirement plan.
- Comprehensive health insurance options, including a high-deductible health plan and PPO plan
