Where did you grow up? I grew up in Houston, Texas.


Interesting fact about your hometown: It isn't uncommon to see someone riding a horse on the road.



NAMI Networking (free event) - Thursday, December 10th 6:00 - 7:30

My name is Mey and I'm a neuroscience major student at Macalester College and an intern at the National Alliance for Mental Illnesses (NAMI) Minnesota. I'm coordinating an event called <u>NAMI Networking and CEUs</u> for young professionals/students to network with others in the field of behavioral health, neuroscience, and/or anyone who is interested in mental health in general.

You can register for this <u>event here</u>. Our guest speaker, **Dr. Kelvin Lim**, will give an educational presentation about how to "Use Your Mind to Change Your Brain". He will address the root of why changing behavior is hard by reviewing the connectivity within the brain. From there he will provide some methods to induce neuroplasticity to change the brain for clinical benefit.

Dr. Lim is Professor and Vice-Chair for Research in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, University of Minnesota, where he holds the Drs. T.J. and Ella M. Arneson Land Grant Chair in Human Behavior. He is also a staff physician at the Minneapolis VA Health Care System. Dr. Lim's research interest is in the use of neuroimaging approaches to identify circuit abnormalities in brain disorders such as schizophrenia, traumatic brain injury, and addiction and then to use these circuits as treatment targets for noninvasive neuromodulation interventions.
