From the BAW (Brain Awareness Week) website: "Brain Awareness Week (BAW) is an international campaign dedicated to advancing public awareness about the progress and benefits of brain research. Brain Awareness Week began in 1996 as a modest effort involving 160 organizations in the United States. BAW was created to bring together diverse groups from academia, government, professional, and advocacy groups and unite them with a common theme that brain research is the hope for treatments and preventions, and possibly cures, for brain diseases and disorders, and to ensure a better quality of life at all ages. Since that time, BAW has evolved into a powerful global initiative with more than 2,200 partners in 76 countries (as of the 2008 campaign)."

### Meet Dr. Goff Tuesday, March 27 4:45

**Dr. Goff** is a Member of the Faculty and Vice Chair for Research in the Department of Psychiatry at New York University Langone Medical Center (NYUMC). He is also Director of the Nathan Kline Psychiatric Research Institute. Prior to coming to NYUMC, Dr. Goff was the Director of the Schizophrenia Clinical and Research Program at the Massachusetts General Hospital and Professor of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School. An international expert in translational neuroscience research in schizophrenia, Dr. Goff is also an award-winning clinical expert and teacher. He has received the Stanley Dean Award for Research in Schizophrenia, the Wayne Fenton Award for Exceptional Clinical Care and the American Psychiatric Association Award for Mentorship in Biological Psychiatry.

Dr. Goff's research is directed towards identifying biological mechanisms that contribute to the onset of schizophrenia and that shape the clinical course. Results from this work are leading to novel, individualized interventions for prevention and to promote recovery. His research team includes experts in brain imaging, genetics, pharmacology, cognitive behavioral therapy and cognitive remediation. http://psych.med.nyu.edu/donald-goff-md

#### MUPC is Saturday, April 28

The Minnesota Undergraduate Psychology Conference is Saturday, April 24 at Gustavus Adophus. This is the 47th annual Minnesota Undergraduate Psychology Conference. This one day annual conference promotes undergraduate research in the field of psychology and will feature oral and poster presentations of student research. The keynote speaker is Laurie Santos, an Associate Professor of Psychology at Yale University and the director of Yale's Comparative Cognition Laboratory where she and her graduate students study the evolutionary origins of human thinking. She also conducts her research with primates at the Cayo Santiago field station off the coast of Puerto Rico and the Lemur Conservation Foundation Myakka City Reserve in Florida. Dr. Santos received her A.B. in Psychology and Biology

from Harvard University in 1997 and her Ph.D. in Psychology from Harvard in 2003. She started teaching at Yale in 2003. In 2007, Dr. Santos was selected as one of Popular Science Magazine's "Brilliant 10" young scientists and in 2010 was an invited speaker at the TED Global Conference. Recently, Dr. Santos received the 2012 APA Distinguished Scientific Award for Early Career Contributions to Psychology in animal learning and behavior. Dr. Santos explores the topic of human irrational behavior, examining where it comes from and whether there is an evolutionary basis for our biased decision-making.
