Author/Psychologist Daniel Gilbert to Speak at Opening Convocation September 4



Author Daniel Gilbert, bestselling author of *Stumbling on Happiness* and professor of psychology at Harvard University, will speak at Macalester's opening convocation at 11:30 a.m., Thursday, September 4, in the Alumni Gymnasium in the Leonard Center. A complimentary lunch will follow the convocation.

Gilbert's 2007 book, *Stumbling on Happiness*, has been translated into more than 33 languages, and was awarded the Royal Society's General Book Prize for best science book of the year. In 2010 he co-wrote and hosted the award-winning PBS television series *This Emotional Life*, which has been seen by more than 10 million people. He is a contributor to *Time*, *The New York Times*, the *Washington Post*, and NPR's *All Things Considered*, and has been a guest on numerous television shows including *The Today Show*, *Charlie Rose*, *20/20*, and *The Colbert Report*. His TED talks have been seen by more than 13 million people and are among the most popular of all time.
