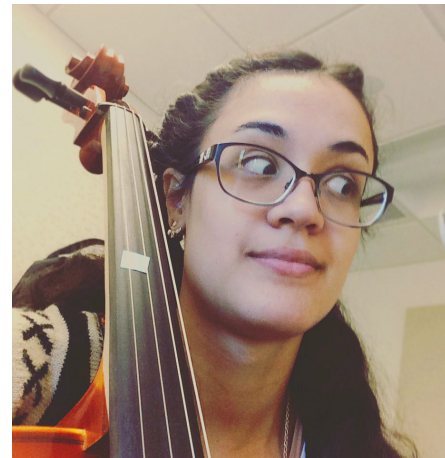

The 2018 Macalester Summer Internship Grant program (MSIG) will provide funding to support 30-35 Macalester students doing vital 10-week unpaid summer internships anywhere in the world. Learn more about this great opportunity at 4:45 p.m., Tuesday, December 5, in Campus Center 215. The selection committee will prioritize confirmed internships that have potential to be highly impactful on one's studies and career ([see program info and all selection criteria](#)). Accordingly, it is very important that you plan ahead and set up a great experience as early as possible. There are two application deadlines, the first being on February 28—your chances improve significantly if you can arrange your internship by this early deadline. The second deadline is March 28, so you may still apply even if your internship is taking more time to arrange. Plan early, think big!
