

# 1. The Sustainability Office



# 3. MULCH Garden

The MULCH Garden is a student-run garden located between the Spanish and German language houses. In addition to providing a model for urban agriculture and gardening, the MULCH garden supplies Macalester students with fresh produce.



As well as the MULCH Garden, MacShare is a great resource for fresh produce — its a student led organization that runs weekly pop up sales during the semester. Food is purchased from local farmers and sold to the Mac community at cost.
